Message from the Headteacher

How lovely to be back working full time now. I have observed children outside and inside, I have worked in class and supported at lunchtime. Your wonderful children have shown what independent learners they are; they demonstrate kindness and curiosity. I would like to once again thank those staff who have taken on and continue to support me by taking on extra responsibilities. We have such a busy half term ahead as you will see when you read on. **Our learning**In Bumblebees the focus has been going to the toilet and nappy changing. Children have been using the key words nappy, wipes, pants, knickers and toilet. The key text is 'Dinosaurs love Underpants!' Children have been using dolls as babies and helping change their nappies and using potties. Children have also been exploring junk modelling and learning how to use glue. Children in Dragonflies class have been thinking about space. Key words have included planet (including the planet names), rocket, star and astronaut. The key text has been 'Whatever

rockets from recycled materials and enjoying the space station role play. Ladybirds class have also been thinking about places. Key words have included town, road, farm and field. The key text is 'My town'. Children have been enjoying the role play hospital and

Next'. Children have enjoyed sensory play with soil and numbers. Children have been making

the small world farm and train track. The pupils in Caterpillars class have been learning about Superheroes and talent shows! Their keywords have included dance, sing, talent and superhero. The key text has been 'Supertato'. Children have been using the stage to perform with a different focus each day- such as singing and dancing including some ballet. The children have been using their imaginations to build a superhero city and access the superhero Numicon.

Children in Butterflies have been learning about Minibeasts. Key words include earwig, wasp, slug, beetle and centipede. Children have been exploring the indoor forest school area and using ladybirds to add and count spots.

Outside children have extended their water, sand and mud play.

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School Readiness (Taken from the 'Starting School' leaflet on the website.) There are certain skills which will support your child in being ready for their life at school. Can your child sit still and listen? This means, can your child sit and listen, not to the television, but on other occasions which do not involve technology? Can they sit and listen to a story? Can they sit and talk over a family mealtime for a short time? Do they ask questions and listen to the response? Can they respond to simple questions appropriately?

Monitoring
 My observation of outdoor learning showed ✓ Positive learning environments with organised, appropriate resources for children to self- access across all curriculum areas e.g. large spades for gross motor, books for reading, chalks for mark making etc.
 Staff were observed appropriately supporting language and communication e.g. simplifying language, repeating back, using commentary, asking open questions Staff were observed supporting literacy; early reading e.g. sharing books in reading area & mark making with a range of materials including chalks, pens and pencils
✓ Staff were observed supporting Maths e.g. measures
✓ Staff were using subject specific language
 Problem solving was seen e.g. using smaller pots in water tray to fill other containers The characteristics of effective learning were evident, especially playing and exploring & active learning
 ✓ There were outstanding relationships between adults and children and children and children ✓ Learning was enjoyed with smiles and humour
 There were high levels of engagement; all children were involved in learning Behaviour expectations were reinforced appropriately for example with a reminder about kind
hands
✓ There were high levels of independence e.g. children making choices
 Children with different cultures, languages were learning together harmoniously
Children with additional needs were sensitively supported
 Waiting Before Sessions Begin Please do not arrive too early as children get bored. Please ensure you are monitoring your child and their behaviour. 
Teddy Bear's Picnic (children only)
